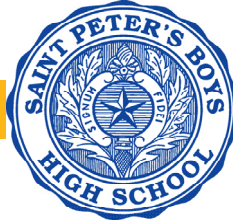

The James O'Malley Scholarship Program at St. Peter's Boys High School

Established by Thomas D. '59 and Mary Alice O'Malley

The James O'Malley Scholarship Program at St. Peter's Boys High School was established in 2018 by Thomas D. '59 and Mary Alice O'Malley in honor of Mr. O'Malley's father, James, a former U.S. Customs officer serving in New York City. The program provides scholarships annually to sons of active duty or retired New York City Policemen and/or U.S. Customs and Border Protection officers based in New York City. Each scholarship will provide approximately 75% of the total annual tuition for each student for their four (4) years of enrollment at St. Peter's Boys High School. Each awardee family will be required to pay only a flat fee of \$3,000 per school year. Parents and/or lawful guardians of incoming Freshmen who are eligible to apply should contact the President's office at St. Peter's Boys High School.

AVAILABLE SCHOLARSHIPS:

- Sons of active duty or retired New York City Police Officers:** Approximately 75% tuition scholarships are available for eligible incoming Freshmen.
- Sons of active duty or retired U.S. Customs and Border Protection Officers:** Approximately 75% tuition scholarships are available for eligible incoming Freshmen.

SCHOLARSHIP DURATION & ONGOING QUALIFICATION:

Each awarded James O'Malley scholarship will be provided to awardees for approximately 75% of annual tuition for all four (4) of their enrollment years at St. Peter's Boys High School. Grades and conditions will be reviewed each year before continuing awards are granted.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES & PRIORITIES:

- Applicants must submit elementary school grades as presented on their 9th grade applicant record of referral (provided by applicant's elementary school guidance counselor).
- Applicants must submit two (2) letters of reference.
- Recipients must maintain a minimum 85 final average in each award year with no failures and remain in good disciplinary standing to maintain program eligibility.

Late applications will not be accepted. Those receiving awards will be notified by July 15, preceding the school year to which the award is applied.

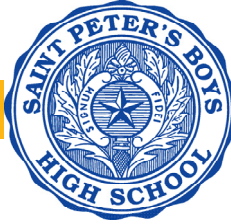
